

## SIGNIFICANT MILESTONES

- We've collected signatures of thousands of women in 2007 and 2008 by participating in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh's [Pa. Governors Conferences for Women](#). Lynne Honickman was also a featured speaker at the 2008 event. We plan to attend in September 2009. Perhaps you'd like to join us. It's very informative -- and fun!
- Two major billboard companies – Interstate Outdoor Advertising and Clear Channel Outdoor donated more than 30 billboards throughout the region to Moms Against Guns to help increase awareness before the November 2008 elections.
- In 2008, we witnessed an historic vote on lost and stolen guns in the PA House of Representatives. Unfortunately, it was defeated by a 76-to-126. It was not enough and today that same bill languishes in the house.
- In the same election, Moms Against Guns produced and ran several print ads to support selected candidates. We helped to educate voters about the candidates who would vote for better gun laws if elected or re-elected.
- We co-hosted a community outreach and education program with Drexel's School of Public Health that focused on the trauma that gun violence brings to neighborhoods and families. Our partner Project H.O.M.E hosted the event at the Honickman Learning Center in North Philadelphia. Dr. John Rich was the featured speaker.
- In 2009 we began our effort to make presentations on college campuses and will continue in the future to hit hard virally with our web through [Twitter](#), [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#).
- We collaborate wherever appropriate -especially with [CeaseFirePA](#), [Brady Campaign to End Gun Violence](#), [Million Mom March](#), [Drexel's University's School of Public Health](#) and [Project H.O.M.E](#). we laud the mayors in PA who are building a strong force through "Mayors Against Illegal Guns."
- We participated in major rallies in the capitol in Harrisburg that brought together citizens, victims' families, law enforcement, mayors from throughout the Commonwealth, Governor Rendell and many others who want legislation to stem the flow of illegal guns in Pennsylvania. We plan to there again this year when major laws are brought to the floor for a new vote.
- To date, we have 5,562 signatures, which represent your voices and letters sent to specific representatives demanding they support their constituents and the passage of common sense gun laws. We realize we are far away from our 50,000 goal—and plan to escalate our viral effort dramatically.
